111th Pioneer Award Winner Christine Duffy Class of 1979

Christine DeVone Duffy is currently the first-ever woman president of Carnival Cruise Line, the biggest brand in the fleet of Miami-based global cruise industry leader Carnival Corp. As president of the largest cruise line operator in the world, she's the captain of a company that sails a fleet of 26 ships, annually hosts more than five million guests and employs more than 40,000 people who hail from more than 110 nations around the globe.

Christine's mother is French, and all of her family is in France. Growing up, she spent summers in France, and traveled on vacations with her French cousins. She got the travel bug quite early!

After graduating from Frankford, Christine got a job as a receptionist at a travel agency on Walnut Street in Philadelphia, which was travel agency row. After six months, she went down the street to McGettigans Travel Bureau. This was 1982 and she was hired by Norbert McGettigan, who met her in the reception area and said, "Hire her." So for \$200 a week she became a travel agent in Philadelphia. McGettigans did a ton of cruise business back when the QE2 was in Philadelphia. They had even done the wedding of Grace Kelly. In 2001, the agency was acquired by Maritz Travel Company, and three years later Christine became the first woman president and CEO of Maritz.

In 2011 Christine was approached by the Cruise Lines International Association (CLIA) to run their trade association in Washington, DC for the cruise industry. While at CLIA, she elevated the industry's profile before consumers, regulators, industry stakeholders and the media; led the industry's adoption of the Cruise Passenger Bill of Rights to enhance the industry's commitment to passenger safety, comfort and care; managed the industry response to several high-profile crises; and consolidated a network of 15 cruise industry organizations into one global association with offices around the world. In 2015, Christine moved on to join Carnival Cruise Line.

Christine sits on the executive committee of the U.S. Travel Association and currently serves as its second vice chair, as well as the Professional Advisory Board of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. She has been a strong supporter of women's leadership in the travel industry, leading initiatives that delivered research and programs to help women advance their careers. Christine is also a member of The Committee of 200, an organization of the world's most successful women business leaders that supports, celebrates and advances women's leadership. She was recognized by Moves magazine as a 2016 Power Women recipient for her work in serving as a role model for future generations of young women. She has received honors from the Convention Industry Council, the U.S. Coast Guard, and the South Florida Business Journal.

She and her family live in Miami, but travel often to Philadelphia and Cape May.
